# Subject: Continuation of ongoing schemes beyond 12th Five Year Plan: Instructions regarding

The undersigned is to directed to refer D.O letter no. 66(14)/PF-II/2017 dated 05.07.2017 received from Dr. Snadeep Dave, Joint Secretary (Expenditure) giving reference to D.O letter no. 66(14)/PF-II/2017 dated 30.06.2017 from Shri Ashok Lavasa, Finance Secretary asking to appraise schemes of Ministry by the end of July, 2017.

2. It is mentioned that comments on following schemes are been given by EFC cell (either to be appraised by EFC/SFC), <u>but clarifications on the observations made are still awaited:</u>

3. For the following schemes, no information is received by concerned SMDs for the appraisal:

9 9	DRIP RMBA Flood Management Plan	To be appraised by EFC
*	Farakka Barrage Project Flood Forecasting Irrigation Census	To be appraised by SFC

- 4. Third Party Evaluation is required in terms of Para 12 of Dept. of Expenditure OM dated 05.08.2016 for Appraisal and Approval of Public Funded Schemes and Projects for continuation of schemes from 12<sup>th</sup> Plan to remaining period of 14<sup>th</sup> FC (2017-2020). Continuation of any scheme beyond 12<sup>th</sup> Plan period will be contingent on the results of such evaluation.
- 5. In order to provide a uniform evaluation criterion for all schemes, it is felt that the TPA should cover the following aspects. These evaluation with be part of the SFC/EFCs and since appraisal would be done at the level of Finance Secretary/ Cabinet, the exercise should be carried out comprehensively. The following aspects should be covered under such evaluation.
  - i. Executive summary covering Key findings and glossary of terms used
  - ii. Scheme summary covering
    - a) Background and objective;
    - b) 12th Plan approved outlay;
    - c) Identified components of scheme;
    - d) Physical & financial progress under the said components;

#### iii. Evaluation

- Review evidence on outcomes of schemes, especially financial progress vs. physical progress. Whether the output is commensurate with the expenditure incurred;
- b) Comparison of performance with other sectoral/comparative schemes
- c) Reasons for shortfall if any
- d) Positive points/drawbacks

### iv. Overview of findings and conclusion particularly vis-à-vis

- a) Outcome assessment of performance in 12th Plan
- b) Need for continuation of specific components under the scheme and possible merger with other MOWR, RD&GR schemes.
- c) Inputs for improvement
- d) Identification of quantifiable and monitorable parameters under the scheme.
- v. Recommendation as to continuation of scheme beyond 12<sup>th</sup> Plan with existing/merged/new components with quantifiable parameters for benchmarking success in 14<sup>th</sup> FC (2017-2020). If the scheme is recommended for continuation, the improvements in the process, implementation mechanism, guidelines etc. should be suggested.
- vi. While making recommendations to continue the scheme, following points should be specifically addressed:
  - a) why is the scheme being continued;
  - certifying that there is no convergence either with any of the schemes of MoWR or any other scheme of the Government of India;
  - Keeping in view the funds allocation in the last two years and the current year, the projection of the funds should be made and prioritizing the allocations in different projects/components;
  - d) Improvements proposed in the guidelines, processes, implementation mechanism, monitoring to make scheme more effective;
  - e) How will Outcomes be judged?
- 6. It is requested from all the concerned SMDs to pace up the work for the appraisal of schemes for the remaining 14<sup>th</sup> FC period, so that the exercise of appraisal and continuation of schemes is completed in stipulated time.
- 7. This may please be accorded TOP PRIORITY.

Dear Dr. Singh,

Please refer to the OMs dated 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2016, 23<sup>rd</sup> February, 2017 and 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2017 with regard to the appraisal of schemes which are to be continued beyond the 12<sup>th</sup> Plan and till the 14<sup>th</sup> FC period. While the continuation of the schemes has been extended till 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2017, these schemes, depending upon their size have to be appraised either by the EFC or SFC. Needless to add that, those schemes that emanate from legislation or already have been appraised for continuation beyond 2019-20, need not be appraised.

- 2. I understand that a total of 6 schemes of your Department/Ministry are to be appraised by the EFC. In order to avoid an unnecessary rush towards the end of the September window, I request you to ensure that all your schemes are appraised by the end of July, 2017 and taken up for appraisal.
- 3. I would appreciate if you personally review the matter and apprise me of the status and action plan pertaining to such schemes within a week.
